Marriage Minute



The Father is "there". The Father is AVAILABLE. The Father is waiting, and wanting you to ask Him for help, guidance, and peace. DO you love God? How MUCH do you love God? HOW DO you love God?

Close your eyes and take a breath... think about how many times in the last month, the last week, even just today... How many times has God's Mercy, Grace, and Protection been shown to you and your spouse?

Psalm 63: 1, 3, 7, 8

1 O God, you are my God; earnestly I seek you; my soul thirsts for you; my flesh faints for vou, as in a dry and weary land where there is no water.3 Because your steadfast love is better than life, my lips will praise you. 7 for you have been my help, and in the shadow of your wings I will sing for joy. 8 My soul clings to you; your right hand upholds me.

I have struggled and been all over the place trying to put this Marriage Moment together. Then Pastor Andrew used these verses as part of his sermon Sunday. A couple points really hit me: "Are you in love with God" and "Do you love your spouse more than God"? I am reminded multiple times daily of God's love, grace and mercy that has been poured all over me! My soul thirsts for the sparkle in Angie's eyes, her soft touch as we sit in church or as she walks by, or to hear her say "I love you". She lost the sparkle for many years after I hurt her, and it has finally returned in the last couple years! God is showing me some of His love through my beautiful wife. Her love is better than life. God continues to show me grace and mercy through my Angie. I am overwhelmed. Now back to Pastor Andrew's questions... Am I in love with God? YES. Do I love my spouse more than I love God? That is a TOUGH ANSWER. I hope I have never loved her more than God, but it is soooooo close! Maybe it's even a good answer that she is so close. I mean, she forgives much like God forgives me. She shows me mercy and grace, much like God does...

Then yet another hard question came to mind: If I love my wife as much as I say I do, but many times fail at making her feel loved, am I even close to showing my God how much I love him?

I told Angie of my deep, philosophical thoughts. She basically said: David, remember The Five Love Languages that we teach? We are pretty knowledgeable on the topic, but that doesn't mean we are experts at the performance of those duties. She, very wisely, taught me that even though she and I speak very opposite love languages, and we sometimes have trouble making each other feel loved, that our God knows, and speaks all FIVE languages. So that when I love on God's children in my languages, Acts of Service, Words of Affirmation, Physical Touch, that God "feels" my love for Him. God knows my heart, my inner being, my soul. God knows what I have trouble articulating. God knows how I FEEL. Still, that doesn't take me off the hook. I still need to purposely speak Angie's Love Languages of Quality Time and Gifts, because she is not God. She doesn't know all until I tell her / show her.

I hope this means something to someone, but if not, I needed to write it. **David**

From the Pastor's Desk-

Beloved Church,

As we enter this sacred season, my heart is full of affection for you and full of awe at the wonder of Christ's coming. Christmas is not sentimental filler in the Christian year. It is the blazing center of God's eternal plan a plan formed before the foundation of the world, accomplished in the fullness of time, and destined to bring His redeemed people into everlasting joy.

At the heart of Christmas is this unfathomable truth: the eternal, self-existent Son of God took on flesh. The One who spoke galaxies into existence (John 1:1–3), who upholds the universe by the word of His power (Heb. 1:3), who was worshiped by angels from eternity past He stepped into our world as an infant. Some of you will walk into December with heavy burdens, quiet sorrows, or lingering fears. Others will enter with gratitude, laughter, and sweet memories. Whatever your season looks like,

remember this: the God who came near in Bethlehem is the God who draws near to you now. He is the Wonderful Counselor to the confused, the Mighty God to the weak, the Everlasting Father to the lonely, and the Prince of Peace to the troubled (Isa. 9:6).

In our church family, this Christmas season is also an opportunity to love one another well. Let us be tenderhearted toward the hurting, generous toward those in need, and eager to encourage one another with the hope of the gospel. The world may settle for shallow cheer, but we labor for something far deeper that Christ formed in us, the glory of God reigning in our affections, and the truth of Scripture anchoring our lives.
